Helen E. Evard's Descendants of Bartholomew Jacoby (Green-
field, Ind. 1955) describes, at pp. 76-77, the family of Anna
Jacoby (1827-1872), who married Adam Strawderman (c. 1822-1889).
Mrs. Evard states:

Adam married, second, before 1880, a widow, Mrs. Levina
Harrington (1835-March 29, 1889). Her tombstone reads,
"Aged 53 years, 5 months, 18 days." She had three sons by
her former marriage, David, Simon and Samuel Harrington."
I assume that this tombstone is probably in the Jacoby cemetery
at Plymouth, as that is where Adam and Anna were buried. Mrs.
Evard goes on to describe Adam and Anna's son Peter Strawderman:
PETER STRAWDERMAN (Nov. 15, 1855-1919) married, April 7,
1881, Mary Jane Disher (d. 1919), daughter of Samuel and
Levina (Busenburg) Disher, and step-sister to Peter. They
had two children: Chancey Adam, m. Ella Gettinger of
Wisconsin, and had a son Harold; Stella May (1890-1908).

Child:

Thomas bought a lot in Bourbon, Marshall County (32' x 123' in the E2 of NE4 of section 24) on 5 Aug 1867 from Geo. W. Moore and wife. Thomas, as Thomas "the /3/," and Frances Ann Disher sold it on 12 Apr 1871. (2:548 & 4:42)

In the meantime, on 11 Mch 1869, Thomas "of Marshall County" bought 40 acres in section 7 (T 32, R 5) in Kosciusko County from Joshua and Martha Scott. (32:512) Thomas and Francis A. Disher sold that land to Anderson Boggess on 23 Apr 1870. (35:401)

By 1880, Thomas and Francis are in Adams precinct, Gage County, Nebraska, immediately adjacent to the household of Stephen Disher (p. 8, ln 13; #62):

Francis's obituary appeared in The Adams Weekly Globe for 2 May 1912, at p. 5, col. 4:

Francis Jordon Disher was born April 25, 1838 in Stark Co., Ohio, and died at Adams, Nebr., April 23, 1912.

She lacked 2 days living to see her 74th birthday.

She moved with her parents from Ohio to Indiana when she was five years of age. She was married to Thomas Disher, Feb. 28, 1858. They moved from Indiana to this state in 1876.

To this union five children were born: Mrs. Minnie Silvernail, of Indianola, Neb; Mrs. Elma M. Mosby, of Adams; Mrs. Cora L. McCartney, who died July 20, 1882; P. J. Disher, who died Dec. 27, 1906; Delbert F. Disher, of Belpre, Kan; the grandson, W. W. McCartney, was brought up in her home.

Mrs. Disher and her husband united with the M. E. church of Adams, July 20th, 1888.

She has lived all these years a beautiful christian life. She was a great sufferer in these weeks of her sickness, but patient and gentle in spirit amid all her afflictions.

She was ready to go and ever longed to be at rest. Her

faith never wavered in the valley of the shadow of death.

"Servant of God, well done!

Thy glorious warfares past.

The battle's fought; the race is won

And thou are crowned at last."

Funeral services were held at the M. E. church Thursday afternoon, conducted by Rev. G. R. Newkirk, and interment [sic] took place in Highland cemetery.

Francis and Nancy Jane are listed in the household of her parents in Peru, Miami County, Indiana in the 1860 census. Francis was a boatman.

Nancy is listed at 24 North Miami in Peru, Indiana in the 1900 census (ED 106, sh 2, ln 83; 47/49):

Her birthdate in this record is somewhat ambiguous. It may well be June 1837, instead of 1836, in that her parents were said to have been married in June 1836 and her age is given as 63 in the 1900 census.

She is said in that census to have had four children, only one of whom was then alive, clearly her son Christopher, who was then living with her. It appears that Christopher used the name Dick, as he made application under the name Dick Pernee for reimbursement of the expenses of the last illness of his uncle Christopher Disher in 1916, stating that Julia Pernee was among those that nursed the deceased. Christopher Pernee is recorded as having married a Julia Miller in 1903. In addition, the obituary of Polly Disher, Nancy's mother, mentions the names of her ten grandchildren, including Christopher Pernee of Peru. Christopher Disher's obituary, on the other hand, states that he died at the home of his nephew, Dick Pernee.

Christopher enlisted in Company A, 13th Indiana Infantry on 11 Feb 1864 at Peru, Indiana. At that time he was age 23, 5 foot 8 inches, with blue eyes, fair [complexion] and sandy [hair]. He listed his place of birth as Madison County, Illinois, his occupation as a farmer and his current residence as Washington township, Miami County, Indiana. He was courtmartialed for straggling on the march on 13 Oct 1864 and ordered to forfeit \$10 of his monthly pay. He was promoted to corporal on 2 Dec 1864 and discharged at Goldsboro, North Carolina on 5 Sep 1865.

In 1870, Christopher and Matilda are listed in the census of the third ward of Peru, Miami County, Indiana (p. 4 (195B), ln

21; 28/31):

Beginning in October 1890, Christopher made several pension applications on account of his military service. He generally states that he was born in Madison County, Illinois, but at one point says it was Macoupin County. He names his wife as Matilda Bucher and states that after the war he resided at Peru, Indiana until 1873, in Marshall County until 1877, at Etna Green until 1901 and then at 122 Elsworth, Warsaw beginning in 1901. They had only one child. Christopher's nephew Dick Pernee applied for reimbursement of expenses stating that Christopher had come to his house in Peru sick on 5 Aug 1916 and was nursed by Julie A. Pernee and others.

Matilda Disher bought lots 3 and 4 in Etna Green on 14 May 1886 from Matthew and L. Taggart. (64:169) Chris Disher is recorded as having bought the same property on 9 Jan 1897 from C.E. Seneff and Matilda and Chris are recorded as having sold it to C.E. Seneff on the same day. (78:100 & 101) Thomas L. and Polly Disher sold Lots 5 and 6 in Etna Green and Lots 3 and 4 in David's Addition to Etna Green to Chris Disher on 24 Jun 1898 for \$1, reserving a life estate in the property and requiring Chris to provide them a decent and respectable burial at their death. (80:501) Christopher, Matilda and Polly sold these lots on 13 May 1902 to Phema A. Beach for \$550. (87:224)

In 1900, Christopher and Matilda were living on Cherrie Street in Etna Green, Kosciusko Co, Indiana (ED 47, sh 2; 37/41):

Matilda's obituary states:

Matilda Beecher, daughter of Wm. and Julia Ann Beecher, was born in Franklin county, Ohio, Oct. 11, 1833, died in Warsaw, Kosciusko county, Ind., April 4, 1916. Aged 82 years, 5 months and 23 days. She was married to Christopher Disher in Peru, Ind., Sept. 27, 1866. To this union two children were born. Both died in infancy. They moved to Etna Green, Ind., in 1874, and to Warsaw, Ind., in 1902, where they have since resided. She has been a member of the M. E. church for many years and lived a consistent Christian life. She is the last member of a family of eight children, six girls and two boys. . . .

Christopher's obituary reads:

Christopher Disher, a well known citizen of the northeast part of Warsaw, died at the home of his nephew, Dick Pernee, at Peru, at 6:45 a.m., on Wednesday, death being due to a general break down. Mr. Disher, who was 76 years of age, went to Peru several

weeks ago to visit and had been confined to the house since that time. He leaves a sister, Mrs. Nancy Pierce, of Peru, and another sister, Mrs. Virginia Shaffer, of Lafayette. The remains will be brought to Warsaw, arriving here at 1 p.m. on Friday. Interment will be at Oakwood cemetery

The marriage of Virginia Disher and Moses Coons was performed by Minister J. R. Edwards. An infant son of M.J. & C.A. Coons died on 10 Oct 1858 and was buried in Wooden Cemetery, Harrison township, Kosciusko Co. (Lester H. Binnie, Kosciusko Co., Ind. Cemetery Records V:45 [1977]). Moses J. Coons was in Etna Green in Kosciusko County in 1860 (p. 8, ln 39; 75/75):

Jeptha Disher, as administrator of the estate of Moses J. Coons, sold Lot 7 in Block 8 in Etna Green to Mary A. Riggins on 5 Mch 1889. (65:389)

Virginia and Samuel were living with Virginia's parents on Pearl Street in Etna Green, Indiana in 1900. Neither could read or write. Sam was a razor grinder. Virginia had had 2 children, both of whom were alive. It seems likely that Sam was a second husband for Virginia, as the 1900 census indicates that they had only been married 11 years and in 1889 Virginia would have been 46, probably too old to have two children, particularly if they did not live with her in 1900.

At the time Virginia's brother Christopher died on 1 Nov 1916, she is said in his obituary to be living in Lafayette, Indiana.

Perhaps Georgia was the daughter of Christopher Disher, even though Christopher described himself only as having a son named George who died in 1868.

Mary presumably died prior to the death of her mother Polly Disher on 2 Sep 1912, as Polly's obituary refers to her living children and doesn't mention Mary. The obituary does mention the names of ten surviving grandchildren, including Mrs. [sic] G. F. Andrews, Wakarusa, Ind.; C. L. Andrews, Warsaw; J. F. Andrews, Bristol, Ind.; Thomas Andrews, Goshen, Ind.; and Mrs. Edith Huftile, Goshen.

I haven't been able to locate Joseph or Mary Andrews or Anderson in the 1900 census. I have found what may be a couple of their children in the 1900 soundex:

Eliza and Timothy also appear to have resided in Marshall County on 10 Sep 1885, when they signed a quit claim deed as heirs of James Axley Stallard. Stallard Connection at 767.

The Marshall County Historical Society's The History of Marshall County, Indiana (1986) contains, at p. 358, the following information contributed by Helene Linn Reichert:

In the fall of 1836, my great-great-grandfather Solomon Linn moved from Nicholas County, Kentucky to Marshall County. He settled where the town of Bourbon now stands. His eldest son, Timothy Thompson Linn, helped clear the ground for cultivating. Later Timothy attended a medical school in Ann Arbor, Michigan, and then was graduated from Rush Medical College, Chicago, Illinois. He practiced medicine for forty years before his death in Bourbon in 1896.

Amanda is listed in the Bourbon township household of her sister and brother-in-law, Timothy T. and Eliza H. Linn, in the 1860 census.

Winfield was a First Lieutenant in Company D, 73rd Indiana Infantry, which company also included William H. Kaiser, who married Amanda's sister Nancy. Daniel McDonald, History of Marshall County, Indiana 1836-1880 at 62 (1881).

Winfield bought Lot 12 in J.W. Thomas's Addition to Bourbon from Peter and Martha Jane Disher on 24 Apr 1874. (10:224)

Winfield and Amanda resided in Marshall County in 1871. Amanda joined the Old Settler's Society in July 1879, having been born in Noblesville, Indiana 25 Aug 1848 and settled in Marshall County in October 1852. Id. at 48.

I haven't checked Albina's parentage in the Sons and Daughters of Randall Iden, but she is buried with Eliza Iden (1820-1906) and Washington Iden (1815-1903), presumably the parents of the G.W. Iden who married John Disher's sister Alice. An infant, name not given, is buried in the same plot with the date July 1, 1867.

John Disher purchased an undivided 41/48 interest in the SW4 of the SW4 of section 21 and the north half of the NW4 of section 28 in Bourbon township on 16 Mch 1869 from John H. Sprangle et al. and the remaining 7/48 on 4 May 1869 from Reginia Sprangle (X:203 & 11:557) John and his wife sold that land on 28 Mch 1871 to Elizabeth and Rowan Nye. (5:144)

On 12 Dec 1872 from William Garrison and wife, John bought most of the west half of the SE4 of section 20 in Bourbon township, plus the land north of the railroad tracks to the south in the NE4 and NW4 of section 29. (7:392) I didn't find the deed by which this land was sold, but I only checked through 1886.

Towner County, North Dakota Families by Mabel Jacques Hadler (1958+), at v. 2, p. 299, states that John and Nancy resided at Bourbon until 1899, homesteaded in Cavalier County, North Dakota and then settled at Egeland in Towner County. My information concerning their children comes from Mrs. Hadler's work.

An article in The Bourbon Mirror for July 19, 1900, at p. 1, was titled "Mrs. John Disher -- Writes A More Hopeful Letter From North Dakota," is from Arndt, North Dakota and dated July 13, 1900 and states that the drought has broken and that Will Disher and his wife and John Disher and son Stanley went to the mountains at Killarney, Manitoba.

A biographical sketch of Peter in the History of Indiana (Marshall County), at p. 166-67 (1890), states:

The subject of this sketch was reared on the farm, received a common school education, and on attaining his majority engaged in the mercantile business at Bourbon, where he carried on a successful trade for nine years. He closed out his business in 1879, from which time until 1886, he resided upon a farm near the village of Donaldson, during which time he carried on agriculture in connection with the lumber business. In the latter year he moved to Plymouth and engaged in the manufacture of flour, purchasing the Eureka mill which he thoroughly remodeled in 1889, supplying new engines and boilers and the latest improved machinery for the manufacture of flour by the roller process. His plant is a very valuable one, contains four double and one single set of rollers, and has a daily capacity of seventy-five barrels, besides manufacturing large quantities of crushed feed for which there is a constantly increasing demand. The well-known "Disher Boquet" brand of flour is noted for its excellence, and has much more than local reputation. Mr. Disher is a member of the Royal Arcanum and Maccabee fraternities, and as a citizen commands the respect of all who know him.

Peter T. Disher bought 60 acres in section 29 in Bourbon township from Mathew and Lavina Taggert on 27 Jan 1875 (12:96) and I assume that most of the subsequent Peter Disher transactions in the Marshall County records relate to him, but my extracts are generally inadequate to separate his deeds from those of his uncle.

The newspaper The Bourbon Mirror mentioned Peter's closing his dry goods store:

May 8, 1879: Peter Disher has stored his stock of dry goods and groceries and abandoned the mercantile business for the present.

May 22, 1879: Peter Disher has traded his stock of dry goods and groceries to S.L. McKelvy & Co. for a farm.

I assume it was this Peter Disher and not his uncle that was forced to make a general assignment for the benefit of his creditors in 1901. Peter (who appears to have purchased the interest of his partner prior to 1 May 1901), being indebted to diverse persons in sums he was unable to pay in full and being desirous of providing for payment so far as possible, assigned to Dwight L. Dickinson the south 55 acres of the west half of the northwest quarter of section 26, township 34, range 1 in Marshall County, subject to two mortgages, one of \$1600 and the other of \$1000, both to St. Joseph County Savings Bank. He also assigned the "stock of groceries, provisions, crockery, Queensware, tobaccos, store fixtures and all articles in and belonging to the store of Peter Disher, located in the building of Dickinson & Gretzinger, Plymouth, Indiana," valued at \$1900, and book accounts, wagon and harness worth \$100. It appears that Peter and his partner were declared insolvent bankrupts by the federal court.

Beginning in 1878, when she was conveyed land by her parents, Martha Jane Disher seems to have engaged in a large number of Marshall County land transactions in her own name. She left a will, dated 23 Mch 1908, naming her sister Manda Coar, children Florine Acker, Helen Metzler, Charles Disher and Blanche Disher, and her husband Peter. Arthur Metzler was named administrator. (Marshall Co probate estate # 2252)

V. Gilmore Iden's Sons and Daughters of Randall Iden (1941) states, at p. 88, that George "lived at Etna Green, Indiana in 1864; Sterling, Nebraska and Paola, Kansas. He served in the UNION Army from June 4, 1861 to June 18, 1866, as a member of the 25th Ohio Infantry, Company A. Mustered out as a lieutenant. Was in the Second Battle of Bull Run, taken prisoner and passed through Libby Prison, Richmond, but was soon exchanged. Was acting Assistant Adjutant General at Columbia, South Carolina, when the Civil War ended."

Lelia R. Heil's Genealogical Abstracts from the Tecumseh Chieftain . . . 1873 to 1900 at 163 (1970) gives the following extract dated March 29, 1884:

G.W. Iden was born in Carroll Co., Ohio leaving there he settled for a time in northern Ind. Came to Sterling precinct Nov. 20, 1869. His house burned in 1876. Has 320 acres valued at \$6,500 to \$10,000. Failed at raising small grain for money. Now falls back on corn and hogs. The same source, at p. 251, mentions the Oct. 2, 1897 (Sterling) notice of the marriage the previous Tuesday of the Rev. Shermon Hill and Zellora Iden.

A History of Johnson County, Nebraska, published about 1889, contains a more extensive description of George's military service and states (at pp. 328-30):

After leaving the army in 1866 Mr. Iden passed three years in Indiana quietly engaged in teaching and farm labor. On the 11th of November, 1869, he was united in marriage to Miss Alice Disher, and they moved at once to their present farm in Nebraska, where they have since lived. Mr. Iden has been very successfully engaged in agriculture, and has his farm, whose soil is rich and productive, under good improvement, well supplied with neat and tasty buildings and all the conveniences for carrying on farming to a good advantage. The married life of our subject and his wife has

been exceedingly pleasant, and to them have been born two children, one of whom died in infancy. Their daughter Zella is in her fifteenth year. Mrs. Iden's parents and grandparents were natives of Kentucky, but she was born in Whitewater, Ind. Her parents and brothers are now living near Bourbon, Marshall Co., Ind.

William received about 220 acres from Jeptha Disher in sections 29, 32 and 33 in Bourbon and Tippecanoe townships on 23 Sep 1878. (16:502) William sold 60 acres of this land on 3 Apr 1883 to Stephen D. Guy and Harriet Mark (30:504), 40 acres on 11 Apr 1883 to Nancy J. Disher (45:133) and probably about 10 acres on 2 Nov 1883 to David E. and Julia A. Melser (30:504). The remaining conveyances presumably came after 1887, which records I have not reviewed.

Towner County, North Dakota Families by Mabel Jacques Hadler (1958+), at v. 2, p. 300, states that Virginia Craig moved to Bourbon with her parents in 1873. William and Virginia came to North Dakota in 1900, farming near Snyder Lake. In 1902, they homesteaded near Hansboro, which is only about three miles south of the Manitoba border. My information concerning their children comes from Mrs. Hadler's work.

On 10 Mch 1903, Ida Poe and her husband James A. Poe executed a deed of partition of property in Mason County with John J. and Edna Disher. The land was that bequeathed in the will of John L.
