Florence was born on the "homestead," one and one half miles southwest of Adams. She received her education in the public schools of Adams and in the State Normal at Peru. She taught school near Adams for two years. Perry came to Adams from Indiana with his parents in 1876. He was converted in the winter of 1890-91 and united with the Methodist Church.

After their marriage, Perry and Florence resided in Adams and nearby communities for six years while Perry taught school. In 1898, they moved to Lincoln, Perry having accepted a position in the Burlington railroad offices. When the car accountants office was transferred to Chicago in 1903, they moved there with the rest of Perry's office. They were members of the Adams Methodist Episcopal Church, the Trinity M. E. Church in Lincoln and the First M. E. Church in Downers Grove, Illinois.

Perry was taken sick on Sunday morning, 23 Dec 1906, with what was supposed to be La Grippe. On Wednesday, the attending physician noticed symptoms of pneumonia and on Thursday he was taken suddenly worse and lived only five minutes. A family story is that he became sick after working all night in a poorly heated office.

After Perry's death, Florence returned to Adams with her children. She was employed as night operator at Adams by the Lincoln Telephone and Telegraph Co. until her retirement in Sep 1937. She also served as librarian of the Adams public library for the nine years previous to her death. She was a member of Constance Rebecka lodge No. 373 until about a year previous to her death when this lodge was consolidated with the Golden Rod Rebecka lodge No. 398 of Panama of which she remained a member until her death.

Blanche is mentioned in Shirley Willard's Fulton County Folks, vol. 1, p. 86 & 197, as a teacher at Columbia School in Rochester. She is listed in 1964-65 as a paid up member of the Fulton County Historical Society.<sup>ii</sup>



A sketch of Milo King appears in Barnhart's History of Indiana -- Fulton County, v. III, p. 226-27 (1923):

Milo O. King was born on his father's farm in Newcastle township and received his elementary education in the graded and high schools of that township. He then taught in a public school for four years, and at the conclusion of that time, went to Valparaiso University from which he was graduated in 1893 with the degree of Bachelor of Science. Wishing to follow the medical profession, he attended Rush Medical College, of Chicago, and was graduated from that institution in 1896. For twenty-three years he has been in active practice in Rochester, Indiana, but upon his graduation from college he became an interne in the hospital for the insane at Kankakee, Illinois, after which he was on the medical staff of that institution for three years. To keep in touch with all things pertaining to his profession, Dr. King holds membership in the American Medical Association, the State, Thirteenth District, and the Fulton County Medical Associations. He has always been actively interested in politics, and in November 1921, he was elected mayor of Rochester on the Democratic ticket, he being the fourth man to hold that office. On May 15, 1922, he married Blanche Distor, of Plymouth, Indiana. In fraternal circles, Dr. King is a member of the Knights of Pythias, the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, and the Masons, being a Shriner and a York Rite Mason.

Milo and Blanche had no children. Both left wills abstracted in Jean C. and Wendell C. Tombaugh's Fulton County, Indiana Wills (briefed) 1836-1974 (1983). Milo's will, made 4 Nov 1950, mentions his wife's sister and brother, Florence Acker and Charles Disher, as well as Arthur Metzler, surviving husband of Helen A. Metzler, "sister of my said wife." Also mentioned (aside from Clymers and Kings that were clearly his relatives) were John Acker, Helen Anderson, Betty Smalley, Jane Taylor, James Acker, Robert Disher, James Disher, Willis Disher and Helen Dickenson.

Blanche's will, drawn 23 Oct 1971, mentions her cousin Dorothy Judah Trowbridge of Bourbon, Indiana and Mrs. Mary Nell Disher of Tupelo, Mississippi. Also mentioned were Elizabeth Acker Smalley, John Acker, James E. Acker and Jane Taylor, "children of Florine Acker," and Robert Disher. Blanche referred to Scott Smalley, Thomas John Acker, Adam Milo Smalley and Robert Michael Acker; Mary Acker, John F. Smalley, Peter Grant Acker, Charles Lee Disher, Susie M. Acker, Tom Smalley, Timothy Acker, James Taylor and Peter Lakeland Acker as "my grandnieces and grandnephews." She also left bequests to Grace Methodist Church of Rochester, Indiana and to Timothy Acker, Peter Curtis Acker and Susie M. Acker, Jr., "children of James E. Acker."

Johnnie Disher of Maysville made his will on 6 Mch 1961. He asked that headstones be erected at the Germantown Cemetery for himself and his wife Lizzie to match those erected by him for his parents. He left \$300 in trust to the State National Bank of Maysville for the care of the lot at Germantown where his parents, wife, "our child," and he were buried. He bequeathed \$500 to Trinity Methodist Church and the remainder to his sister Clara Disher Henson. If she should predecease him, he left one-third of the remainder to his brother Owen Disher of Felicity, Ohio and one-sixth each to his nephews and niece:
