

## SUMMARY OF McGRATH FAMILY OF SULLIVAN COUNTY, NEW YORK

1. **PATRICK McGRATH** was born about 1830 in Ireland.<sup>1</sup> He died between 1880 and 1900.<sup>2</sup> He married **FRANCES C. \_\_\_\_**. The 1850 New York census lists them as having been married within the year, but also lists a child age 2 in their household, born in Ireland. Frances was born in May 1832 in Ireland.<sup>3</sup> The 1900 census indicates that she immigrated in 1855, although she was clearly in Sullivan County in 1850.

Four of their children have been located in the 1920 census, which lists both the birthplace and mother tongue of parents. In three out of four cases (John J., Lawrence and William H.), the parents, i.e., Patrick and Frances, are listed as born in Ireland and native speakers of Irish (the exception is Reuben, whose parents are native speakers of English). This seems likely to be accurate, as the wives of both John and Lawrence had parents born in Ireland whose parents described as speaking English.

Patrick McGrath seems likely to have been a brother of Lawrence McGrath, in that they were enumerated in adjacent households in both 1850 and 1860, and Patrick named a son Lawrence. Family tradition also indicates that Lawrence came to the United States with a brother. In addition, pallbearers at the 1933 funeral of Mary Elizabeth (McGrath) Lynch included relatives "John and Charles McGrath, sons of Lawrence McGrath, of Livingston Manor." Lawrence McGrath of Livingston Manor appears to have been the son of Patrick McGrath.

In the 1850 census, Patrick and Frances were living in the town of Liberty, Sullivan County, New York (p. 206; 1448/1464; 19 Sep 1850):

In 1900, Frances is listed in the household of her son Lawrence. She is shown as a widow, born in May 1832 in Ireland, and having immigrated to this country in 1855. In 1902, a newspaper account of her 70<sup>th</sup> birthday, found on the Internet, says she then had 34 grandchildren.

In 1910, Frances was still living with her son Lawrence. She was described as age 77 and having immigrated in 1847 and had 10 children, of whom 7 were living.

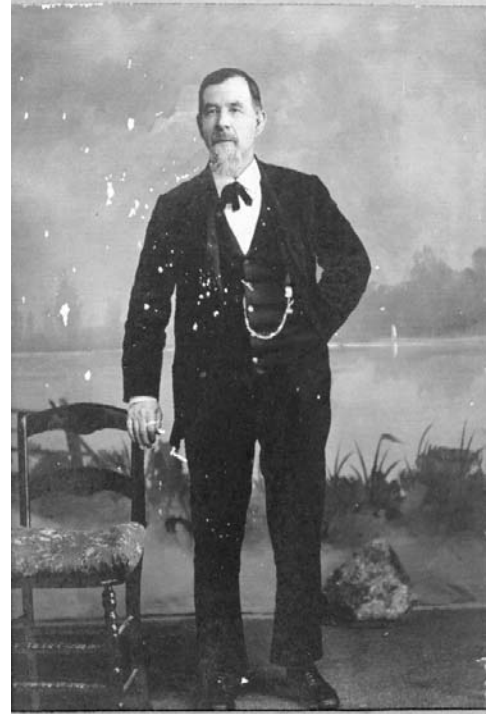

2. **LAWRENCE MCGRATH** was born in December 1831 in Ireland, a son of James McGrath and \_\_\_\_ McKay, and died at Liberty, Sullivan County, New York on 20 June 1908.<sup>4</sup> He married **ANN KEOGH**. She was born in 1835 in Ireland, and died in 1892.<sup>5</sup> They are both buried at the Liberty Cemetery.

Family tradition (both Joan and Robin) is that Lawrence McGrath came to this country at age 12 with an older brother. Joan adds that the brother was age 19 and that the family went down to the dock to say goodbye to him and Larry hid on the ship. She says that Larry worked in a cigar factory in New York City. The 1920 census listing for Mary (McGrath) Lynch indicates that both her parents were native English speakers.

A Lawrence McGraw, age 23, a laborer born in Ireland, is listed in the 1850 census in Liberty, New York (p. 104; 19 Sep 1850), in the household of John Stickle, landlord. The adjacent household was that of Patrick McGraw, age 20, a teamster, and his wife Frances C. and daughter Catherine, age 2. The 1900 census indicates that Lawrence immigrated in 1855, but this census is suspicious as to dates, as it gives his age as 60 and birth as 1839, much later than other records.



Lawrence and Ann are clearly the couple living in the town of Liberty, Sullivan County (P.O. Liberty) in the 1860 census (p. 110; 26 Jul 1860; 868/864):

3. **JOHN J. MCGRATH** was born in March 1851 in New York, a son of Patrick and Frances C. McGrath, and died in 1937. He married **KATHRYN M. \_\_\_\_\_** about 1884. She was born in February 1863 in New York and died in 1936. They are buried in Liberty Cemetery.

John lived at home in 1870 and 1880. In 1900, he was a farmer renting a farm in Rockland, Sullivan County, New York (ED 97, sh 7B):

4. **WILLIAM H. MCGRATH** was born in March 1856 (perhaps 1855, given his age of 5 and 15 in the 1860 and 1870 censuses) in New York, a son of Patrick and Frances C. McGrath. He married **MARY ELIZABETH** \_\_\_\_ about 1881. She was born in December 1859 in New York.

William was living at home in 1870 and absent in 1880. He may have been the William McGrath, age 24, who was a school teacher in Rockland town, Sullivan County, New York, boarding in the home of Edward Barker (1880: ED 109, p. 43).

In 1900, William appears to be renting a house in Rockland (ED 97, sh 15B):

5. **LAWRENCE MCGRATH** was born in March 1866 in New York, a son of Patrick and Frances C. McGrath, and died in 1936. He married **HANNAH E.** \_\_\_\_ about 1893. She was born in 1868 and died in 1944. They are buried in Liberty Cemetery.

In 1900, Lawrence and Hannah owned a mortgaged farm in the town of Liberty, Sullivan County, New York (ED 91, sh 19A-B (p. 163)), where they were living together with his mother and his brother Reuben and family:

6. **REUBEN L. MCGRATH** was born on 19 April 1874 in New York<sup>8</sup>, a son of Patrick and Frances C. McGrath, and died in 1949. He married **SARAH E/M. \_\_\_\_\_** in about 1898. She was born in 1875 in New York and died in 1944. They are buried in Liberty Cemetery.

Reuben and Sarah were living on the McGrath home farm in Liberty Town in 1900. Reuben was then a fireman with the New York fire department (ED 91, sh 19A-B (p. 163)). By 1910, they lived in Manhattan (ED 109, sh 4B). They were one of three families renting rooms at 32 King Street:

On 9 June 1910, the New York Times (p. 2) mentioned that Assistant Forman [sic] Reuben McGrath would lead a detail of firemen at the funeral of William F. Healey, killed in a fire on Washington Street. The same paper indicated that the minimum height for New York City firemen was being reduced to 5 foot 7½ inches, from 5 foot 8 inches, on the ground that the average height of New Yorkers was getting less, due to a large alien admixture in the population, and that the Civil Service Board had concluded, contrary to the advice of the Fire Chief, that the reduction in height would not affect stamina and endurance. The minimum weight was left at 140 pounds.

By 1920, Reuben and Sarah were renting a house at 570 Commerce Lane in Brooklyn (ED 95, sh 36A (p. 68)):

7. **HANNAH MCGRATH** was born about January 1857 in Sullivan County, New York, a daughter of Lawrence McGrath and Ann Keogh, and died, probably in Newburgh, Orange County, New York, on 1 June 1915.<sup>9</sup> She married **PATRICK MCDERMOTT** about 1876.<sup>10</sup> Patrick was born in December 1845 in Massachusetts and died on 6 February 1911, probably in Newburgh.<sup>11</sup> Patrick and Hannah are buried in Calvary Cemetery, Newburgh.<sup>12</sup>

The 1889-92 city directories for Newburgh in Orange County lists a Patrick McDermott as a foreman with the West Shore Railroad, living at 219 Water. There was another Patrick McDermott listed in the city directory, although he was a laborer, boarding at 143 Washington, and apparently a son of Andrew McDermott.<sup>13</sup>

By 1900, Patrick and Hannah were renting a home at 95 Smith Street in Newburgh, Orange County, New York (ED 37, sh 6B; 110/125):
